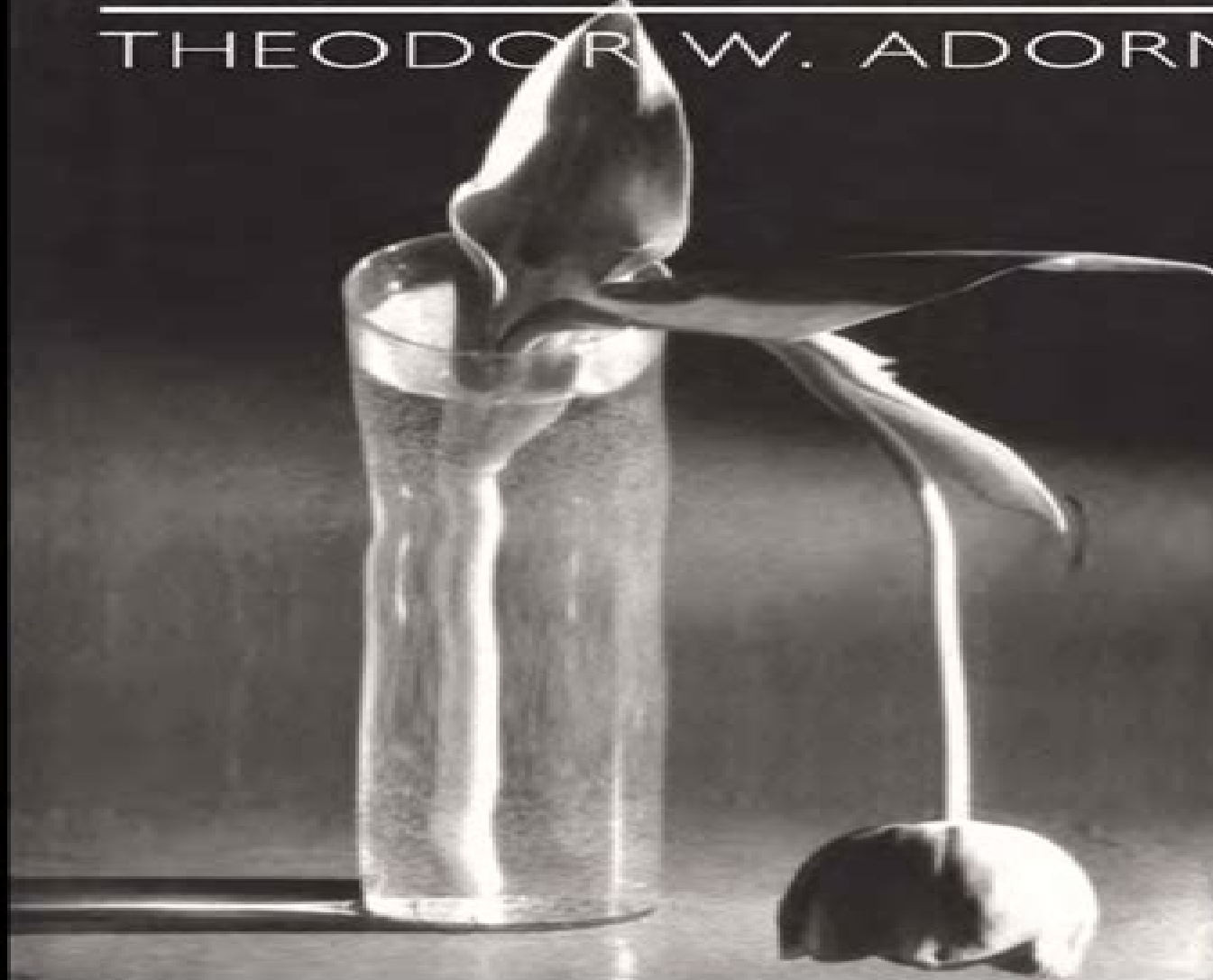

Luther, 2009-06-16 Hegel's enduring importance lies in the fact that his philosophy sheds light on many contemporary problems his conception of freedom enables us to reconcile many of the differences that divide liberalism and communitarianism While liberalism tends to overemphasize the individual and devalue the community communitarianism tends to do the reverse One of his central aims is to integrate liberalism's concern for the political rights and interests of individuals within the framework of a community He tries to reconcile the individual and community in a way that creates the proper mix of liberty and authority One of Hegel's goals is to discover social structures that will allow individuals to escape the alienation that characterizes contemporary life He sought a method of reconciling his contemporaries to the modern world by overcoming the things that split the self from the social world that is a place where people are at home in the social world A sense of estrangement is all too common even for those who enjoy more personal freedom and material abundance than ever thought possible While Hegel is speaking directly to and about his contemporaries their social world bears much in common with ours Consequently his attempt to reconcile philosophical and social contradictions can elucidate our own condition While the modern world reflects important contributions the advent of modern liberalism leads to excessive individualism that fragments social life leaving individuals disconnected and adrift from meaningful social life The major goal of Hegel's political philosophy is to reconcile the individual with his or her political community in a way that overcomes the alienation of modern life

Lectures on Negative Dialectics Theodor W. Adorno, 2014-11-05 This volume comprises one

of the key lecture courses leading up to the publication in 1966 of Adorno's major work *Negative Dialectics*. These lectures focus on developing the concepts critical to the introductory section of that book. They show Adorno as an embattled philosopher defining his own methodology among the prevailing trends of the time. As a critical theorist, he repudiated the worn-out Marxist stereotypes still dominant in the Soviet bloc; he specifically addresses his remarks to students who had escaped from the East in the period leading up to the building of the Berlin Wall in 1961. Influenced as he was by the empirical schools of thought he had encountered in the United States, he nevertheless continued to resist what he saw as their surrender to scientific and mathematical abstraction. However, their influence was potent enough to prevent him from reverting to the traditional idealisms still prevalent in Germany or to their latest manifestations in the shape of the new ontology of Heidegger and his disciples. Instead, he attempts to define perhaps more simply and fully than in the final published version a negative i.e. critical approach to philosophy. Permeating the whole book is Adorno's sense of the overwhelming power of totalizing dominating systems in the post-Auschwitz world. Intellectual negativity therefore commits him to the stubborn defence of individuals both facts and people who stubbornly refuse to become integrated into the administered world. These lectures reveal Adorno to be a lively and engaging lecturer. He makes serious demands on his listeners but always manages to enliven his arguments with observations on philosophers and writers such as Proust and Brecht and comments on current events. Heavy intellectual artillery is combined with a concern for his students' progress.

Negativity and Democracy Vasilis Grollios, 2017-01-12.
