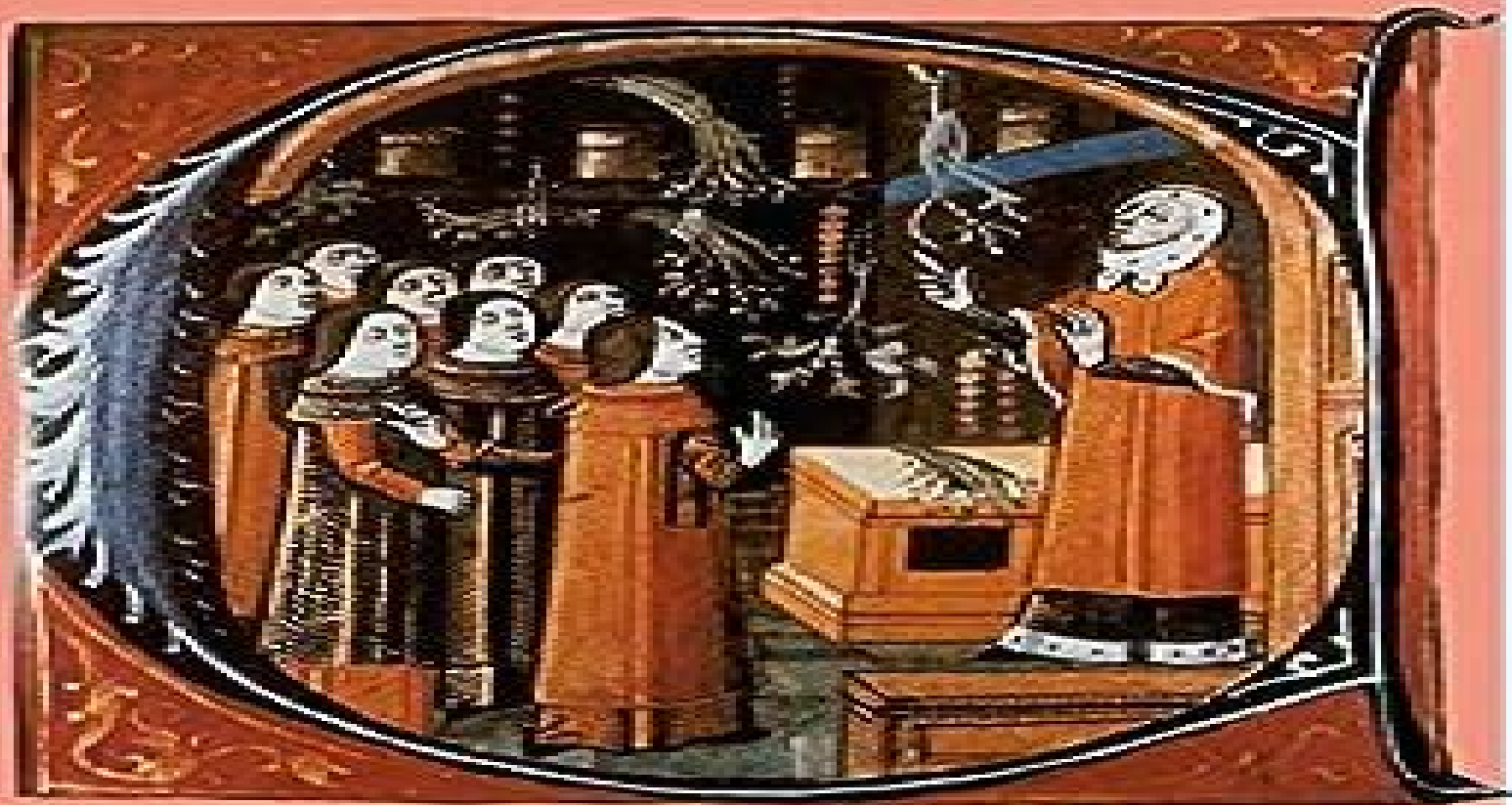

Daß nichts gewußt wird Franciscus Sanchez, 2007-08-01 Franciscus Sanchez 1551-1623 ist ein profunder Kenner der erkenntnistheoretischen Auseinandersetzungen seiner Zeit Sein konsistentes skeptisches Denken und der hohe Grad der Argumentativität seiner Ausführungen machen Sanchez zu einem herausragenden Vertreter des frühneuzeitlichen Skeptizismus In *Quod nihil scitur* dass nichts gewußt wird seinem philosophischen Hauptwerk das hier erstmals in deutscher Übersetzung vorliegt formuliert der frühneuzeitliche Arzt und Philosoph Franciscus Sanchez 1550-1623 eine umfassende Kritik der menschlichen Erkenntnisfähigkeit Er sucht nicht nur die aristotelischen Bestimmungen von Wissen und Wissenschaft zu widerlegen die die Erkenntnis und Wissenschaftstheorie seit Jahrhunderten geprägt hatten sondern er stellt bereits sechzig Jahre vor Descartes die Erreichbarkeit eines sicheren Wissens grundsätzlich in Frage Zu diesem Zweck stützt er sich sowohl auf die zu seiner Zeit wiederentdeckten Argumente der antiken Skepsis als auch auf die antischolastische Polemik der Humanisten Überlegungen zur Schwierigkeit der Wissensvermittlung und zu den sozialökonomischen Bedingungen des damaligen Wissenschaftsbetriebs kommen ebenso zum Tragen wie Verweise auf die zeitgenössische medizinische Literatur mit der er als Arzt bestens vertraut war Besonderes Interesse verdient *Quod nihil scitur* weil Sanchez seine Kritik nicht von außen an die Lehren der spät-scholastischen Aristoteliker heranträgt sondern weil er deren immanente Schwachstellen Spannungen und Widersprüche aufdeckt und so ihr Wissenschaftssystem von innen her aufsprengt Eine umfassende Einleitung verortet Sanchez Skeptizismus systematisch und historisch Der lateinische Text wurde mit den Originalmarginalien unter Berücksichtigung aller relevanten Drucke kritisch ediert und zusammen mit der Übersetzung durch Anmerkungen sowie durch ein Namen- und Sachregister erschlossen

at a time to sit at the feet of a particular master In medicine this meant that over the period c 1500 to 1789 a succession of universities became the medical school of choice for ambitious students Padua and Bologna in the 1500s Paris Leiden and Montpellier in the 1600s and Leiden Gottingen and Edinburgh in the 1700s The arrival of foreign students brought wealth to the university towns and this significant economic benefit meant that the governors of these universities tried to ensure the defence of freedom of religion and freedom of speech thus providing the best conditions for the promotion of new views and innovation in medicine The collection presents a new take on the history of medical education as well as universities travel and education more widely in ancien regime Europe
