Exhausted on the Cross Najwan Darwish, 2021-02-23 A much anticipated follow-up to *Nothing More to Lose*, this is only the second poetry collection translated into English from a vital voice of Arabic literature. We drag histories behind us, the Palestinian poet Najwan Darwish writes in *Exhausted on the Cross*, here where there's neither land nor sky. In pared-down lines, brilliantly translated from the Arabic by Kareem James Abu Zeid, Darwish records what Raul Zurita describes as something immemorial, almost unspeakable: a poetry driven by a moral imperative to be a colossal record of violence and at the same time the no less colossal record of compassion. range of styles that reveals Warren to be one of America's foremost men of letters. In this indispensable volume John Burt Warren's literary executor has assembled every poem Warren ever published with the exception of *Brother to Dragons* including the many poems he published in *The Fugitive* and other magazines as well as those that appeared in his small press works and broadsides. Burt has also exhaustively collated all of the published versions of Warren's poems which in some cases appeared as many as six different times with substantive revisions in every line as well as his typescripts and proofs. And since Warren never seemed to reread any of his books without a pencil in his hand Burt has referred to Warren's personal library copies. This comprehensive edition also contains textual notes, lists of emendations and explanatory notes. Warren was born and raised in Guthrie, Kentucky where southern agrarian values and a predilection for storytelling were ingrained in him as a young boy. By 1925 when he graduated from Vanderbilt University he was already the most promising of that exceptional set of poets and intellectuals known as the Fugitives. Warren devoted most of the 1940s and 1950s to writing prose and literary criticism but from the late 1950s he composed primarily poetry with each successive volume of verse that he penned demonstrating his rigorous and growing commitment to that genre. The mature visionary power and technical virtuosity of his work in the 1970s and early 1980s emanated from his strongly held belief that only insofar as the work of art establishes and expresses a self can it engage us. Many of Warren's later poems which he deemed some of his best rejoice in the possibilities of old age and the poet's ability for continually expanding in a vital process of definition, affirmation, revision and growth, a process that is the image we may say of the life process. *Soviet Fates and Lost Alternatives* Stephen F. Cohen, 2009-06-23. In this wide-ranging and acclaimed book Stephen F. Cohen challenges conventional wisdom about the course of Soviet and post-Soviet history. Twentieth-Century Russian Poetry Katharine Hodgson, Joanne Shelton, Alexandra Smith, 2017-04-21. The canon of Russian poetry has been reshaped since the fall of the Soviet Union. A multi-authored study of changing cultural memory and identity, this revisionary work charts Russia's shifting relationship to its own literature in the face of social upheaval. Literary canon and national identity are inextricably tied together, the composition of a canon being the attempt to single out those literary

works that best express a nation's culture. This process is of course fluid and subject to significant shifts particularly at times of epochal change. This volume explores changes in the canon of twentieth century Russian poetry from the 1991 collapse of the Soviet Union to the end of Putin's second term as Russian President in 2008. In the wake of major institutional changes such as the abolition of state censorship and the introduction of a market economy the way was open for wholesale reinterpretation of twentieth century poets such as Iosif Brodskii, Anna Akhmatova and Osip Mandelstam, their works and their lives. In the last twenty years many critics have discussed the possibility of various coexisting canons rooted in official and non-official literature and suggested replacing the term Soviet literature with a new definition: Russian literature of the Soviet period. Contributions to this volume explore the multiple factors involved in reshaping the canon understood as a body of literary texts given exemplary or representative status as classics. Among factors which may influence the composition of the canon are educational institutions, competing views of scholars and critics including figures outside Russia and the self-canonising activity of poets themselves. Canon revision further reflects contemporary concerns with the destabilising effects of emigration and the internet and the desire to reconnect with pre-revolutionary cultural traditions through a narrative of the past which foregrounds continuity. Despite persistent nostalgic yearnings in some quarters for a single canon the current situation is defiantly diverse, balancing both the Soviet literary tradition and the parallel contemporaneous literary worlds of the emigration and the underground. Rulyova's approach to the study of self-translation is informed by social turn in translation studies. She focuses on the process of text production, the agents and institutions involved, translation practices and the role played by translators and publishers in the production of the text.

place within literary studies Early modern women s writing has been perceived as belated out of sync with dominant critical trends Dodds and Dowd show the belatedness of early modern women s writing to be a happy accident that positions women s writing as a resource for the renewal of literary history In both the classroom and in scholarship early modern women s writing shows the way forward for the field whether in the revitalization of formalist approaches to literature through an alliance with feminism or in the integration of newer critical methodologies such as premodern critical race studies This book demonstrates that a feminist literary history that places women s writing at its center is essential to the future of English Renaissance literary studies There is in other words no history of English Renaissance literature without women writers
