Walter Scott and they drew on the same rescued remains of primitive poetry and popular antiquities that romanticism first used to construct its versions of national identity culture and tradition This book shows how the impulse to salvage traces of ancestral culture and press them to new purpose links the mid century national historical novel to the rise of radical social history and magical realism Post war anticommunism shaped a tradition of the novel as a preserve of art and the individual Mid Century Romance counters with a different genealogy of the British and world novel whose object is society and the future of community the nation and its people It situates its cast of British writers including the modernists Hope Mirrlees and Virginia Woolf the communists Jack Lindsay and Sylvia Townsend Warner the eccentric modernist and sometime fellow traveller John Cowper Powys and the New Left luminary Raymond Williams in a transnational perspective that reaches from Bihar India to Bahia Brazil Gender from Latin to Romance Michele Loporcaro, 2018 This book explores grammatical gender in the Romance languages and dialects and its evolution from Latin Michele Loporcaro investigates the significant diversity found in the Romance varieties in this regard he draws on data from the Middle Ages to the present from all the Romance languages and dialects discussing examples from Romanian to Portuguese and crucially also focusing on less widely studied varieties such as Sursilvan Neapolitan and Asturian The investigation first reveals that several varieties display more complex systems than the binary masculine feminine contrast familiar from modern French or Italian Moreover it emerges that traditional accounts whereby neuter gender was lost in the spoken Latin of the late Empire cannot be correct instead the neuter gender underwent a range of different transformations from Late Latin onwards which are responsible for the different systems that can be observed today across the Romance languages The volume provides a detailed description of many of these systems which in turns reveals a wealth of fascinating data such as varieties where husbands are feminine and others where wives are masculine dialects in which nouns overtly mark gender but only in certain syntactic contexts and one Romance variety Asturian in which it appears that grammatical gender has split into two concurrent systems The volume will appeal to linguists from a range of backgrounds including Romance linguistics historical linguistics typology and morphosyntax and is also of relevance to those working in sociology gender studies and psychology Coarticulation and Sound Change in Romance Daniel Recasens, 2014-04-15 This volume should be of great interest to phoneticians phonologists and both historical and cognitive linguists Using data from the Romance languages for the most part the book explores the phonetic motivation of several sound changes e g glide insertions and elisions vowel and consonant insertions elisions assimilations and dissimilations Within the framework of the DAC degree of articulatory constraint model of coarticulation it clearly demonstrates that the typology and direction of these sound changes may very largely be accounted for by the coarticulatory effects occurring between adjacent or neighbouring phonetic segments and by the degrees of articulatory constraint imposed by speakers on the production of vowels and consonants. The phonetically based explanations presented here are formulated on the basis of coarticulation data from speech production and perception research carried out during
