## EARN A BACHELOR'S DEGREE

Start with a bachelor's degree, focusing on pre-medical courses such as biology, chemistry, and physics. Extracurricular activities like volunteering, research, and shadowing are also crucial.

## TAKE THE MCAT

The Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) is a standardized exam that assesses your readiness for medical school. A competitive score is essential for admission.

### APPLY TO MEDICAL SCHOOL

After completing your undergraduate degree and taking the MCAT, apply to medical schools through the American Medical College Application Service (AMCAS).

## COMPLETE MEDICAL SCHOOL

Medical school typically lasts four years, divided into two years of classroom-based learning and two years of clinical rotations in various specialties, including family medicine.

## ENTER A FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENCY PROGRAM

After medical school, you'll enter a three-year residency program specializing in family medicine, where you'll gain hands-on experience under the supervision of experienced physicians.

## **OBTAIN BOARD CERTIFICATION**

After completing your residency, you'll need to pass the American Board of Family Medicine (ABFM) certification exam to become a board-certified family medicine physician.

## BEGIN PRACTICING

Once certified, you can begin practicing as a family medicine physician in various settings, such as private practice, community health centers, or hospitals.

## PURSUE CONTINUING EDUCATION

To maintain your board certification, engage in continuing medical education (CME), and participate in ongoing professional development.
