Exam performed without relationship to treatment or diagnosis for a specific illness, symptom, complaint, or injury. X Medicare doesn't cover a routine physical (it's prohibited by statute), but the IPPE, AWV, or other Medicare benefits cover certain routine physical elements X Patients pay 100% outof-pocket

IPPE Exam (G0402*)

Review of medical and social health history and preventive services education.

- ✓ New Medicare patients within 12 months of first Part B coverage period

AWV Exam (G0438, G0439)
